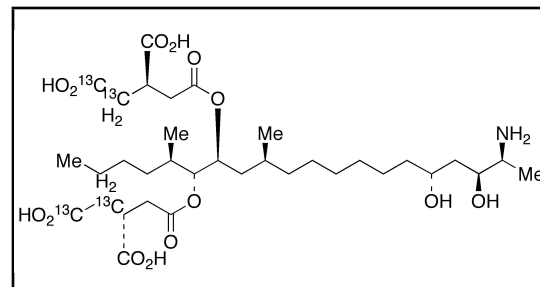

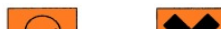

#### **Appropriate Engineering Controls**
